

Protective Security Leadership

Effective protective security supports your business goals and fits your organisational culture. It addresses the security threats and vulnerabilities that put your people, information and assets at risk. Building the right security culture for your organisation is essential. This requires commitment and leadership from the top.

Governance

Establish and maintain a governance structure that ensures the successful leadership and oversight of protective security risk. Appoint a Chief Security Officer (CSO) and Chief Information Security Officer (CISO).

Develop Plans & Policies

Develop and maintain protective security policies and plans to meet your organisation's specific business needs.

Adopt a risk management approach to all areas of protective security activity across your organisation.

Maintain a business continuity management (BCM) programme for the critical functions of your organisation.


Manage

Develop plans to move up to heightened security levels in the event of an emergency or increased threat.

Regular reviews
Review your policies and plans in response to changes in your threat / operating environment.

Build awareness
Provide regular, on-going, relevant information, security awareness training and support.
